Circular About Abacus & Vedic Maths for Grades I to VIII students


Dear Parents,



THE SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Dear Parents.

At Podar International School, we are deeply committed for providing a safe, happy, and enriching learning environment for all our students. As part of our continuous effort to foster a disciplined and respectful school culture, we aim to nurture personal responsibility, mutual respect, and a positive atmosphere where every student can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally. To support this goal, all students are required to strictly adhere to the school's Code of Conduct. This code outlines the expectations

for behavior that contribute to a harmonious and productive school environment. We seek the wholehearted cooperation of parents in upholding these standards, so that every child enjoys a meaningful and joyful school experience.

- Regular Attendance: Students are expected to attend school regularly. 90% attendance is mandatory each academic year.
- Punctuality: Students must report at school before 8:05 am everyday and be seated in their classrooms.
- It is mandatory for students to wear the prescribed school uniform, ensuring that it is clean and properly ironed.
- ID cards should be worn by the students daily.
- Sport uniforms should be worn only on days when there is H/S or PE period in the timetable.
- Girls are required to wear a hair band with both uniforms at all times.
- Black formal shoes and school socks are to be worn with the school uniform, shoes being polished regularly Academic Integrity
- Use of professional appropriate English language is expected in the school premises.
- Bullying, verbal abuse, or physical altercations will not be tolerated.
- Disputes should be resolved peacefully. Students should seek assistance from teachers or counselors when needed.
- Wearing of valuable ornaments and gadgets such as golden chains, ear piercings, wristwatches, smart watches, bracelets, boy's earrings, and is prohibited within the school premises.
- Girl students are not permitted to apply nail polish, lip gloss, or mehndi. Wearing finger rings, gold earrings, or leggings of colors other than those specified is also not allowed.
- Unauthorized Items: Bringing mobile phones, electronic gadgets, or any item not related to academic activities is prohibited.
- Dangerous Objects: Carrying toys seems like weapons /any sharp item /knife/scissor that could harm others is strictly forbidden.

Personal Hygiene and Grooming

Students are expected to take responsibility for their personal health and hygiene. This includes:

1) Keeping nails properly trimmed and clean. 2) Maintaining a neat haircut 3) Wearing a clean and well-ironed school uniform every day. These habits not only promote good health but also reflect discipline and self-respect. Parents are requested to support and reinforce these practices at home.

Healthy Tiffin Guidelines

Students are encouraged to bring a nutritious and balanced tiffin to school. Tiffins should preferably include: Home-cooked, healthy
meals, Fruits and/or vegetables, Salads etc.

Junk food, chips, sugary bakery products, and excessively packaged items should be avoided. A healthy diet supports better concentration, growth, and overall well-being.

Leave & Absence Policy

- Leave Application: Advance message to class teacher is required for 1 day leave through Loop Learning/school diary.
- Absences exceeding two days must be supported by a valid written application or a medical certificate.

Permission for such absences must be obtained from the Principal or the Vice Principal.

- School Birthday Celebration Policy: We value the importance of celebrating special occasions like birthdays. To ensure that these
 celebrations are conducted in a respectful, inclusive, and school-appropriate manner, the following guidelines are to be followed:
- Student birthdays will be celebrated during the morning assembly each day.
- Distribution of Treats: Students may celebrate their birthday by distributing only one of the following to their classmates:
 - A small packet of dry fruits (approximately 2-3 assorted nuts per packet).OR A ₹1 chocolate per student.

Additionally, in lieu of edible treats, students and parents are encouraged to consider the following meaningful alternatives:

- Bringing a potted plant or sapling to contribute to the school's green initiatives.
- Donating a book to the school library to help enrich our learning environment.
- 3. Dress Code: Students celebrating their birthday are allowed to wear decent coloured civil dress on their special day. The attire must be comfortable, age-appropriate, and respectful of the school environment.

School Canteen Policy: The school canteen facility is available only for students who have registered and subscribed for it annually. Seats are allotted strictly on a first-come, first-served basis. The canteen operates in two slots: Primary Section (Grades I to IV) Secondary Section (Grades VI to XII)

Please note: Carrying money to purchase food from the canteen for one or two days is strictly not allowed. As all seats are pre-allotted, it becomes difficult to accommodate students who are not enrolled in the annual canteen plan.

Random Bag Check by Parents: Parents are kindly requested to check their child's school bag randomly on school days to ensure that they are not carrying any unwanted items, electronic gadgets, or money.

Parents' cooperation is highly appreciated in maintaining school code of conduct and student safety.

Zero Tolerance Policy for Students A.Y-2025-26

Podar International School & Jr. College is committed to fostering a safe, respectful, and supportive learning environment to every student. To ensure the well-being and safety of all students and staff, this **Zero Tolerance Policy** establishes clear guidelines regarding unacceptable behaviors and the corresponding disciplinary actions. This policy applies to all students on school premises, during school-sponsored activities, and on online platforms related to school.

Prohibited Behaviors:

The school maintains zero tolerance for the following behaviors:

a) Bullying and Harassment:

- Physical, verbal, or psychological intimidation, including but not limited to teasing, name-calling, spreading rumors, and cyber bullying.
- Targeting peers or staff with discriminatory or derogatory comments based on race, gender, religion, ethnicity, or any personal attribute.

b) Carrying Harmful or Prohibited Items:

- Possession of weapons, explosives, knives, or any sharp object that can inflict harm.
- Carrying or using illegal substances.

c) Harming Peers or Staff:

- Engaging in physical fights, assaults, or acts of violence.
- Threatening or intimidating others with physical or emotional harm.

d) Use of Abusive or Inappropriate Language:

- Using profanity, vulgar language, or offensive gestures towards peers, staff, or visitors.
- Engaging in hate speech or discriminatory slurs.

e) Damaging School Property:

- Vandalizing, defacing, or destroying school property, including classrooms, furniture, technology, or learning materials.
- Tampering with safety or emergency equipment.

f) Misuse of Social Media and Online Platforms:

- Posting inappropriate, offensive, or harmful content related to the school, staff, or students.
- Sharing confidential or misleading information about the school community.
- Cyber bullying or harassment through online platforms.
- Unauthorized access, hacking, or misuse of school-related online systems.

g) Unauthorized Commuting to School via Motor Vehicles:

Riding 2-wheelers and 4-wheelers to school is strictly prohibited as students are not legally eligible to operate such vehicles. In
case any student is found commuting in this manner, the school reserves the right to take appropriate disciplinary action.

3. Consequences and Disciplinary Actions

Violations of this policy will result in immediate and appropriate disciplinary actions, which may include but are not limited to:

- First Offense: Verbal warning, counseling session, and written notice to parents/guardians.
- Second Offense: Suspension for a specific period and mandatory parental meeting.
- Severe or Repeated Offense: Expulsion, legal action (if applicable), and permanent removal from school.
- For Online Misuse: Restriction or suspension of access to school platforms, confiscation of devices (if used inappropriately), and further disciplinary action.

Implementation and Compliance

- All students and their parents are required to read and acknowledge this policy at the beginning of the academic year.
- Non-compliance with the policy will result in disciplinary action.
- The school reserves the right to modify this policy as needed to maintain a safe and respectful learning environment.

Dear Podar Family Members, Warm greetings!

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our dear parents for their overwhelming response and active participation in the online survey conducted regarding the staggered dispersal plan. Your feedback is a testament to your commitment and concern for your child's well-being and the smooth functioning of school operations.

A significant majority—over 90% of the respondents—shared practical insights and suggested the need for staggered dispersal to ease congestion and ensure student safety. Many parents highlighted the increasing difficulty in managing traffic during dispersal hours and voiced genuine concerns about road safety for our students.

Every afternoon, dispersal turns into a challenge akin to daily disaster management. At Podar, student safety is our highest priority. Each one of us, as responsible adults, sets an example for our children – be it through patience, cooperation, or discipline in action. Let us continue to inspire our students with the same values we wish to see in them.

Taking into account your valuable feedback, observations of our school team, and the safety requirements of our students, we are introducing a revised, staggered dispersal schedule, effective tomorrow (on the last day of the PT-1 Exam):
