As we complete 4 years, I look back on the journey we embarked upon together. It is now time for my team and me to look back together and reflect. We must introspect, train and move forward with more strength and conviction that we can deliver far more than we already are. As a school running a globally recognized curriculum it is my opinion that we must research and innovate. Academic and co-curricular routines must be well defined and executed. We have a long way to go in our pursuit of excellence. I assure you though that we are marching towards betterment one step at a time.

With the onset of the next academic session, our 5th year, change is imminent. We are moving to a new location, the first IGCSE batch will be gearing up for their boards. At the juncture when I look back I have a few resolutions I wish to make with you and for you for the new year onwards.

Interdisciplinary Project: During an interdisciplinary session, teachers find ways to collaborate and integrate vocational and academic content through projects that span multiple disciplines. It is found that students' interest in their vocations helps to drive their learning in many of the academic areas. When teachers collaborate and build these connections into the curriculum, students thrive, feel more engaged in the learning, and make real-world connections to what they are learning. This is the intent behind conducting the interdisciplinary projects.

The school encourages vocational and academic teachers to collaborate and integrate as they can. It is done with a whole cohort of teachers working within a grade level. Teachers meet during common planning times before and after school. These sessions enable them to explore new ideas or build themes across classes and disciplines. Much of the collaboration is focused around a particular theme and culminates in a specific project that students create. Projects are used to make connections and show relevancy.

Science Fair: Marking the National Science Day, we are attempting to set a new standard for teaching 21st-century skills by putting decision making in the hands of every middle schoolstudent and teacher. At its best, the program has transformed teaching and learning into collaborative expeditions and turned students into investigators and scientists. It's really about changing the nature of teaching. Sure, the technology did make it easier to conduct research and create multimedia projects, but there are many ways to engage students in compelling and challenging work using whatever technology you have.

- ✓ Make a Tough Topic Fun
- ✓ Focus on Standards -- But Not Too Many
- ✓ Start Small When You're New
- ✓ Test-Drive the Final Product before Starting the Project

I take this platform to thank parents for constructive criticism and feedback. Your inputs will help us reflect and develop better, more challenging and relevant experiments with real-life applications. Next year we will call in for ideas from you as well. This way we will be able to develop the Life skills really required in today's world.



Talking about new developments, we started Clubs which were age appropriate and educative in nature

- ➤ For Primary years Cookery club, Math club, and GK club. These clubs had focused groups performing tasks individually or in groups. Post the yearlong activities these groups culminated in a challenge that saw active participation and involvement of the club members.
- ➤ For Middle years Gab club focused on the speaking and presentation skills of the learners. The focused groups had several challenging and thought-provoking activities which culminated in a debate session for grade VI and VII students followed by a Model United Nations Session for the grade VIII and IX students.

Through such club time activities, a lot of Life skills are built. We have planned in a way that the skills develop holistically alongside their journey through their school life.

It was a moment of pride when the Checkpoint results were announced.

Abhishek, Risha, Hriday and Manya were the top achievers in the Checkpoint Examinations. Abhishek Bhadkamkar secured first position in the examination.

We offer a few external platforms to interested children in the form of the SOF Olympiads and MaRRS spell bee. Our curriculum is demanding enough for us not to dive deeply into these external exams but to offer them to those children who want to go the extra mile. We understand from the exam providers as well as some of our parents that the children excel in these exams, I will give credit to the curriculum they are following.

Our children are encouraged to be intrinsically motivated; yet when given opportunities like these they shine proving to all of us that having 40 or 50 or 5 students in their class is not the factor that affects their performance but it is their own desire to become better selves that drives them. We have 2 qualifiers for international Spell bee. These children will be going to Dubai to compete internationally. They are the only representatives of the Thane district.

We had 2 winners at the National level also.



A GLIMPSE AT THE YEAR GONE BY...

This year has been marked by some noteworthy achievements in curricular and co-curricular areas. We had the International Spell Bee exams where Master Sohum Chatterjee from grade II secured 2ndrank in the MARRS 'International Math Bee' exam. The year 2018-19 has been a very fulfilling and creative year. The year saw some great performances by students in the Annual Concert and the Annual Sports day.

There were also many great contributions and achievements that require special mention for academics:

To start with we had enthusiastic participation from many students across the school in the SOF Olympiad exam conducted in English, General Knowledge, Science, Math, and Cyber.

To add icing to the cake the students of grade VIII cleared the Checkpoint with flying colours which was a result of their hard work and dedication. All students performed well and we got a topper in the exam Master Abhishek Bhadkamkar.

This year we also had our student council elections, the new team has taken over the responsibilities for the year. All our students of grade VIII and IX were given equal opportunities to part take in the selection procedure for the student council election. They were contending for five positions namely; the School Captain- a girl and a boy, Sports Captain- a girl and a boy and Cultural Captain. Additionally, House captains of the two houses Banksia and Waratah were also appointed. The final candidates were given a chance to campaign in one of our school assemblies where they persuaded the student body to vote for them. Grade III to IX then voted for their candidates. The votes were tallied and the final results were declared by the Principal.

Krish Sarkar and Debottama Lahiri were elected as the School Captains. GandharDalvi and Keeyha Todankar were elected as the Sports Captains, Shamuka Tripathy was voted as the Cultural Head. These roles help the students to learn various skills, the most important being the cultivation of leadership quality. These skills help them to face challenges of life at various stages. It was definitely an interesting experience overall. They were given their badge and they took their oath in the Investiture ceremony.

MUN was a successful event that was an endeavour to develop various skills in the students like, speaking skills, research ability, writing skills and so on. In this event, the students were allocated different countries and they discussed and debated about a common issue that affected their countries. The issue they debated on in the MUN was the current trade-war between USA and China. The students who excelled in this event were awarded in the Investiture ceremony. Some of the awards they received were: Outstanding Delegate, Best Delegate, Best Researcher, Best Negotiator, Best Speaker and so on.


Everyone was very happy. They bid goodbye to the 'Alien and Atlantis'. They would never forget this journey.











Overall the event was exuberant!





SCIENCE DISPLAY

Students were encouraged to present their science project results in the form of presentations, working models and experiments. Science display additionally contributed to the social development of the students.






INTERDISCIPLINARY MONTH
