The Chairman welcomed the EPTA members and the teachers. The previous meeting MOM was read by Ms. Geeta Behru.

The Chairman informed the EPTA members that the half year exam completed on 23/09/2022 (Friday) and extensive revision was done in the classes, and the students were very confident during their HY exams.

The Open House of I Term is scheduled on 8th of October 2022. The details will be shared well in advance. After correction of papers teachers will conduct Data Analysis for their class to understand the performance of the students and evaluate their teaching.

Ms. Paromita Panditrao, Vice Chairman informed revision test is of 10 marks, periodic test is 20 marks (byt. HYE is 60-80 marks).

The Chairman said that starting from class test to revision test and half year examination helps kids to prepare them to write for subjective exams.

Ms. Radhika Ghabasi said that she had a concern with regard to III B, that all question banks were given

2 days before the revision test was conducted. i.e. after the books are in complete. Few students she added that it is almost every books are incomplete. This does not happen not only when the child is absent but also if the child is present in the class and has incomplete notes. Children write incomplete multiple books. The Chairman assured that she will look into the matter and the class teacher had some issues as the class teacher has to leave due to medical reasons.

The Chairman said that some of the books are brought to her office for stamp and signature. The Chairman just wanted to know if parents inform the teacher through the portal that the child is absent and connect with the teacher which is important. On Thursdays and Saturdays parents can meet the teachers as shared in PTMs. The Chairman instructed the co-ordinator and Year Leader to look into this matter.

Ms. Shrawanthi Tyoti parent of Grade XII said that students are not honest while writing their exams. They copy or circulate papers during their exams and inspite of strict invigilation they help each other. They are not aware

of the consequences that can take place.

→ The Chairman said students do not take their exams seriously. They have to work hard. Students have to work hard. Students have strong unity, they protect each other. Distance maintained during exam time. The teachers would share the details with the parents, but they find that only 50% attendance during PTMs.

→ The Chairman said that during PTM some parents are not comfortable/embarrassed to talk to the teacher in front of other parents. She suggested to make use of technology and have Google Meet with students and parents at separate timings, so that the class teacher is also aware of what's happening in her class and the progress of the child can be discussed. During PTMs parent can come and check their wards answer sheets and discuss with concerned teachers. All other concerns can be discussed during Google meet, which will save their time. From 28th Sep to 8th October 2022 through a circular this method will start and the teachers will share the details to parents. This will be conducted 4 times in a year.

All the EPTA found this method very interesting and gave their consent.

Ms. Pranjali Jog said that she has counseled Grade 12 and 12+ students. She said that in the teaching learning process parent and teachers are equally involved in the development of the child. Copying during exams is due to peer pressure or standards set by parents. We should educate them and not pressurise them. Every child has their own potential. She said if any help is required from her end for counselling the students, she would be always available to help the school.

→ The Chairman added that parents need to monitor their children and not force them to be Doctors or Engineers. The school also has decided to show motivational videos during their break time. Ms. Shrawanthi Tyoti suggested if any moral value videos are to be shown the Principal should go and speak to the students, as they are bound to listen to the Principal.

Ms. Radhika Ghalsasi is also added that Std III are also casual about their studies. The Secretary informed us that the children are very small and they are back from the

pandemic, so things will move accordingly.

→ The Chairman informed that the Annual Day is planned on the 12th and 13th October 2022 for Std I to V. In the month of November or December the Annual Day for higher grades are planned before the students start with Pre Boards for Grade X & XII.

→ The Chairman informed the EPTA members that 189 parents for 1st Installment and 387 for 2nd Installment are defaulters. Some parents are outstanding from the last 3 years, inspite of concessions, Gray Quest and management support.

The EPTA members were of the decision that those who have default for 3 years should not be allowed to attend the school.

Mr. Rahul Kashikar said Google Feature can be used to send messages to groups and remind the fee defaulting parents.

Mr. Dharmendra Chauhan said if we can have voluntary funds for such parents.

The Chairman said identifying the deserving ones from them should be a classmate


→ The chairman shared that we would have a fee structure with EPTA members.

The Total hike is 14.64% for Primary section, 14.42% for Secondary section, 14.21% for Sr. Secondary (science) section and 14.87% for Sr. Secondary (Commerce) section.

The 5% concession on full year fee payment and 10% as sibling discount will continue.

The EPTA Members approved the fee hike for the A.Y. 2023-24 and 2024-2025.
