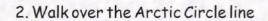


#### 1. Meet Saint Nicholas!

We were stranded in the middle of nowhere, with no sign of civilization in sight. The driver and conductor seemed clueless about what to do, and we were left to fend for ourselves.

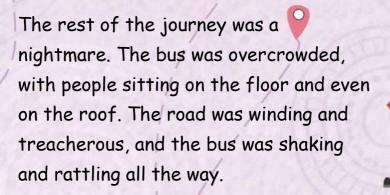
