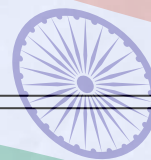

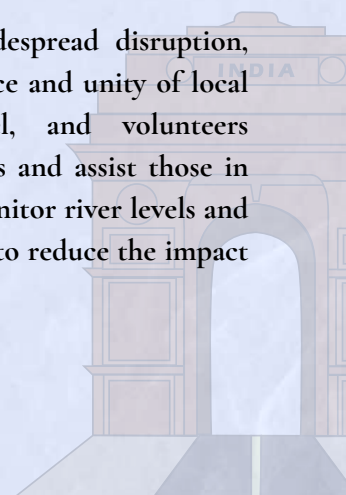

Assam experienced severe flooding after prolonged & heavy rainfall caused major rivers, including the Brahmaputra and its tributaries, to overflow. The floods affected numerous districts, disrupting daily life, damaging houses, roads, bridges, and agricultural land, and forcing thousands of people to move to safer locations. Wildlife habitats, particularly in and around Kaziranga National Park, were also impacted as many animals sought refuge on higher ground.

The NDRE, SDRF, the Indian Army, and local authorities launched extensive rescue and relief operations. Boats, emergency shelters, food supplies, drinking water, and medical assistance were provided to affected families. Volunteers and community organisations also played an important role in supporting relief efforts and distributing essential supplies.

Although the floods caused widespread disruption, they also highlighted the resilience and unity of local communities, rescue personnel, and volunteers working together to protect lives and assist those in need. Authorities continue to monitor river levels and strengthen disaster preparedness to reduce the impact of future floods.

In conclusion, the extreme heat and widespread wildfires across Europe have raised serious concerns about the growing impact of climate change. They highlight the urgent need for stronger climate action, better forest management, and improved disaster preparedness to reduce the risk of such devastating wildfires in the future.



The prestigious Wimbledon tournament took place from June 29 to July 12. The women's singles trophy was presented by the royal Queen of the Netherlands, who handed over the silverware.

INTERVIEW WITH OUR BIOLOGY HOD

*In this interview with the **Head of the Biology Department, Pallavi Doijad**, she provided her insights and advice on her very own subject, which are as follows:*

What aspect of teaching keeps you going?

One would be my subject. We all are living beings, and Biology connects us, so students can relate to it more naturally. Then, of course, the students themselves and their inquisitiveness. Teaching them the concept and watching them learn, understand it and explore it keeps me going on. If one is performing, the audience is what keeps them going, the same is true for me and the students.

What is your best advice for students undergoing academics stress?

The main reason students face academic stress is because they aren't managing their time effectively. It may also stem from a lack of interest in the subject they're studying. They also get distracted due to the internet, AI and other such things. So, to overcome the stress, they should manage their time well and plan out their studies efficiently.

A lot of the time, students know the concept, but struggle to answer due to lack of confidence. How can they overcome this?

Knowing the concept is one thing, and revising it is another. Simply reading the content once will not help. Students should regularly read and revise the textbook, focusing on key points. Solving past years' question papers is also helpful for accuracy in answers and to build the students' confidence.

Have you ever learned something new from a student?

Yes absolutely! The students help me become a better teacher. I learn new things from them everyday, like facts which I wasn't aware of, and how to operate the technical gadgets, which makes classes more enjoyable and worthwhile. Even during Covid-19, they assisted me in handling the online zoom meetings.

I can't appreciate them enough for all their help.

What are some of the most common errors made by students during exams, especially in grade 9 and 10?

There are three types of questions where students mainly make mistakes and lose marks

– Give Reasons,

Find the Odd

One Out, and Specify the Location. In

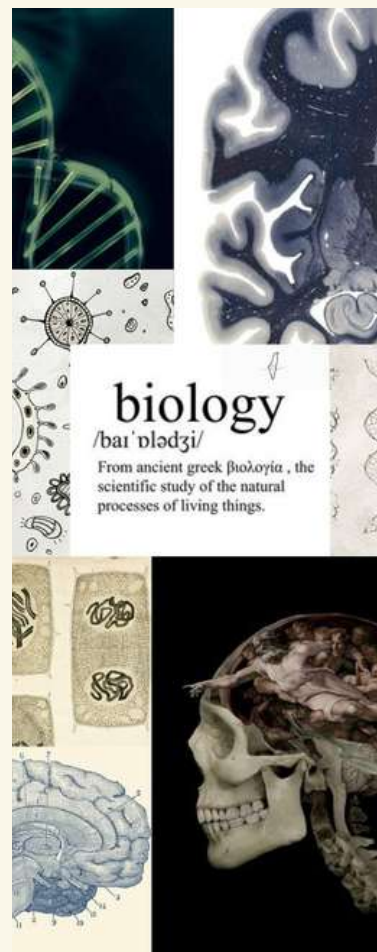
Physics, Chemistry and Biology, specific and accurate

errors. Spelling mistakes are also very common places where marks are lost.



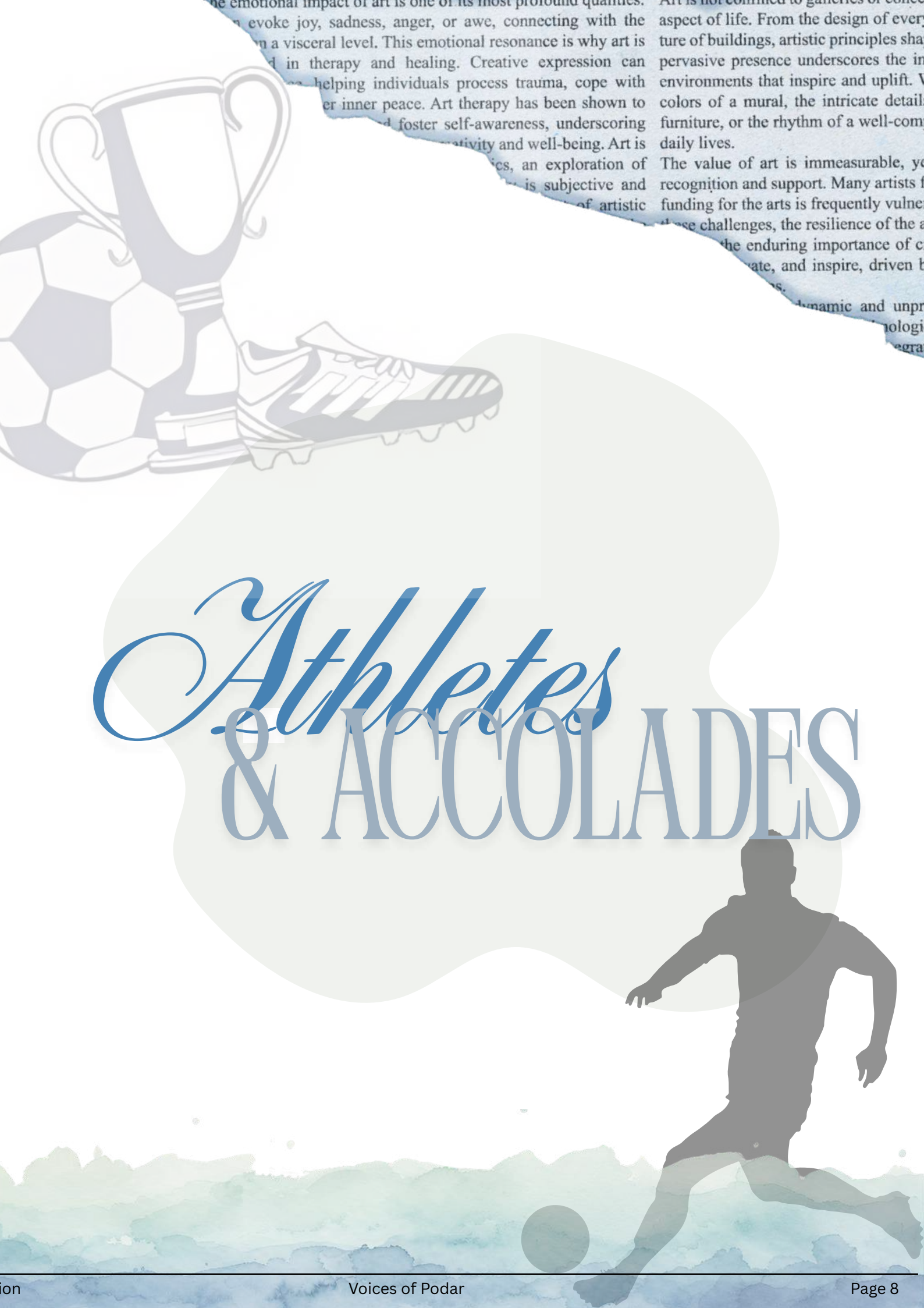
SPECIAL ASSEMBLY

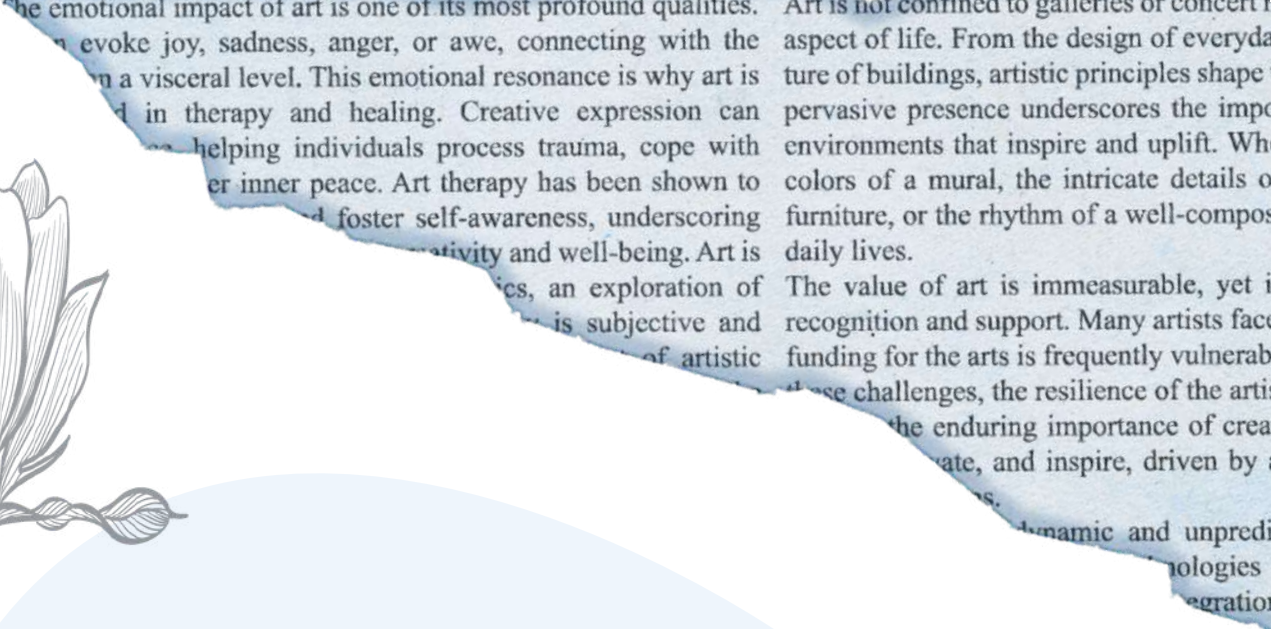

hike.*

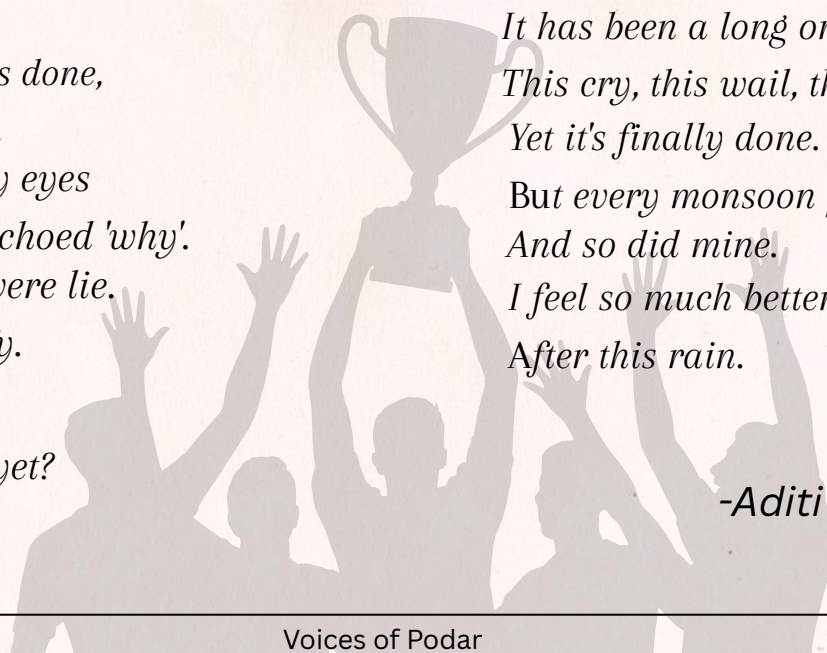
*How many scars do I have to

Making nature fresh & strong,

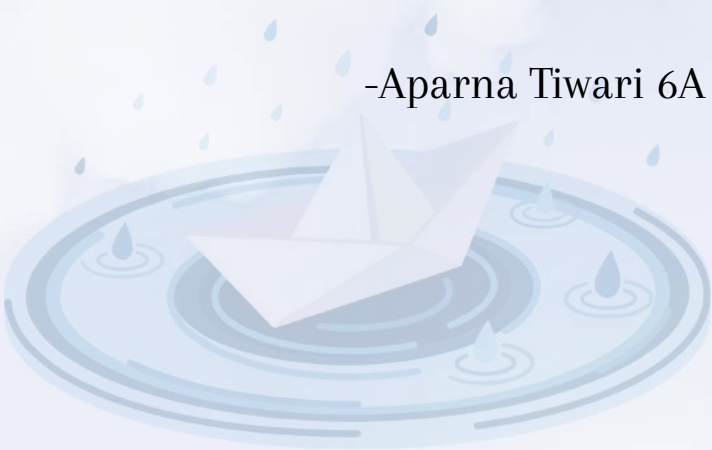

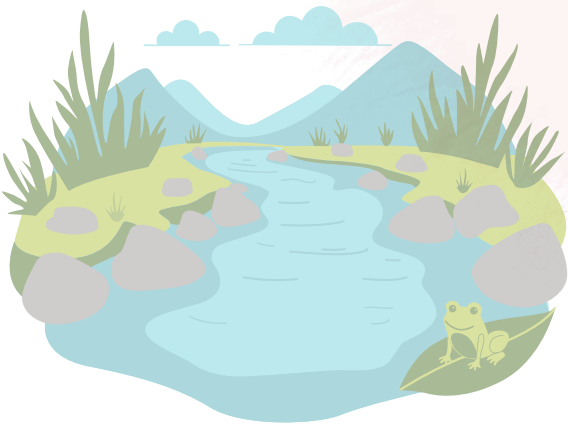
Whispers of the rain
